- A balance between boys and girls
- Students who should be separated based on this year's experiences and influences each has on the other.
- Mix of abilities- we want a clear mix of abilities, independence and leadership strengths
- A learning environment conducive to the success of the student
- In some cases, where a child may receive the most support from support staff
- Contractual obligations

Parent requests are not encouraged, nor are they guaranteed unless there is a sound reason for them and our team deems it relevant to the success of the child.

Any requests submitted must be in writing and to the principal only. Specific requests for teachers are not accepted.

Final class lists will be built in the final days of the first week of school; preliminary lists will be drafted by the middle of June.

Hello again from the Garden! It's been a busy spring with such hot weather and lots of greens, fruit, and legumes are growing in Fairview garden. All Thursday garden classes have helped with weeding, mulching and watering and we are starting to see benefits in the health of the plants and garden critters! Our strawberry beds, have companion plants of garlic, borrage and spinach as well as young asparagus! The fava beans are mostly ready to harvest and students can look forward to yummy recipes next week. Although many of our starts and directly seeded plants (beans, beets, carrots) didn't come up, our peas are showing us they are now getting the water they need (it's been so hot) and you can see flowers and pods forming! We've eaten all kinds of edible flowers, herbs and greens which have made delicious teas and salads. A huge thank you to all the seed, bulb, soil and glove donations that have come in... Sunflowers are just starting to show and the onions are shooting up. There are also squash, zucchini, eggplants and tomatoes - can you find them? Garden class will continue on Thursdays until June 23.
